



Farm induction checklist

We have created the following template to help you conduct farm inductions for new employees, contractors and visitors.

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Terms and conditions of employment

- Outline employee's or contractor's position description.

- Explain the duration and purpose of probationary periods in your business.

- Detailing working hours, including start and finish times, breaks and overtime expectations.

- Describe annual leave, sick leave and any additional leave in your business.

- Provide information on pay rates, payment methods, and the frequency of payments.

- Explain how accommodation functions in your business if applicable. Are there any costs your employees or contractors are expected to cover?

Company policies

- Let inductees know about your farm health and safety policy.
- Let inductees access relevant parts of your farm biosecurity plan.
- Provide your drug and alcohol policy.
- Detail your return to work policy for illness and injury.
- Detail your disciplinary and grievance procedures.
- Provide your visitor policies for areas like biosecurity.
- If your business uses check-in software, you should have a policy detailing how it is used.

Reporting

- Explain the steps employees should follow to report any incidents, including injuries, near-misses and safety hazards.

- Inform inductees about forms and documentation for reporting.

- Let your team know about processes for gathering and recording supporting evidence, such as photographs.

- Let inductees know about your follow-up processes for incident reporting. Explain investigations and execution of corrective actions.

Emergencies

- Provide a comprehensive list of emergency contacts, including local emergency services, farm management, and designated first aid personnel.

- Point out emergency landmarks such as the location of emergency kits, emergency exits and assembly points.

- Give an introduction to emergency equipment such as fire safety equipment and first aid kits.

- Let inductees know about your follow-up processes for incident reporting. Explain investigations and execute corrective actions.

Property tour and farm hazards

- Point out various hazards on your farm, such as machinery, areas where chemicals are used or livestock areas.

- Be sure to point out the location of toilets on your property and other facilities.

- Introduce farm mapping software if it is used on your farm.

Hygiene

- Explain when inductees should wash their hands, such as after handling chemicals, animals or waste.

- Stress the importance of keeping work areas clean and processes for doing so.

Clothes and PPE

- Explain clothing requirements for inductees, such as long pants and boots.
- Explain the PPE that your employee or contractor will need to wear when fulfilling their tasks.
- Explain how PPE should be cared for and maintained to prevent wear and tear.
- Explain how damaged or lost PPE should be reported. Then, explain how to obtain replacement PPE.

Fatigue

- Let inductees know about break policies on your farm.
- Advise inductees of signs of fatigue to look out for. These can include headaches, poor concentration, feeling irritable and micro-sleeping.
- Ensure that inductees understand how to manage their workload. Inform them about task management processes on your farm.

Machinery operation

- Provide a brief introduction on the safe usage of the most important pieces of machinery on your farm.

- Teach inductees about when safety checks should be conducted, and what goes into a safety check for different pieces of machinery.

- Provide detailed instructions on the standard operating procedures for each type of machinery.

- Ensure inductees know the emergency procedures for machinery operation.

Animals

- Introduce safety measures for dealing with farm animals, including protective equipment and safe handling techniques.

- Train employees to recognize signs of distress or illness in animals.

- Emphasise the importance of correct handling to reduce stress and prevent injuries. You should also teach the correct use of handling equipment.

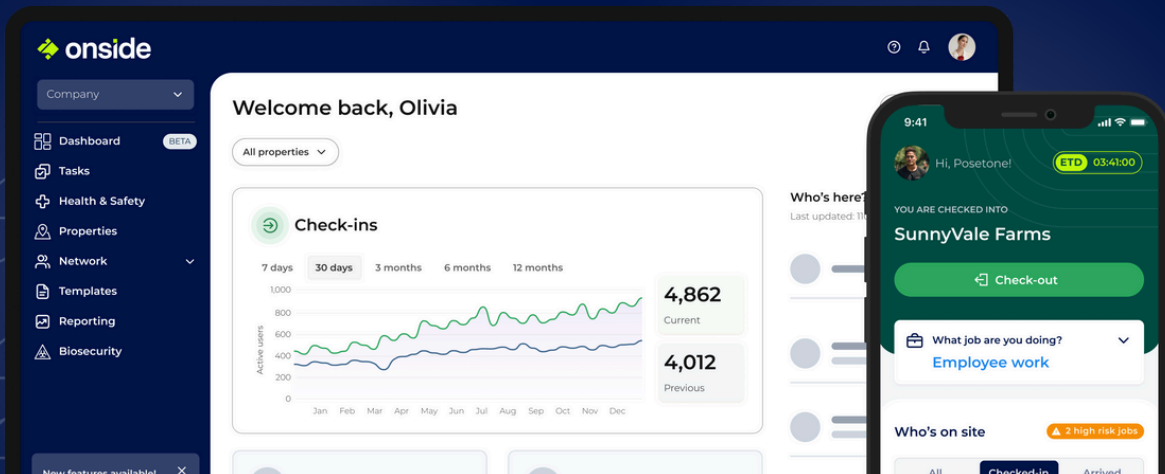
- Instruct inductees about clear protocols for routine animal care tasks, such as feeding, watering, and cleaning.
